BUCK SHOTS

- The Milwaukee Bucks and Indiana Pacers continue their First Round series with Game 6 on Thursday at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indiana. The Bucks extended the series to Game 6 with a 115-92 win in Game 5 at Fiserv Forum on Tuesday. Another Bucks win in Game 6 would force a Game 7 back in Milwaukee on Saturday.
- The Bucks have now held the Pacers to their two-lowest scoring games of the season in their two wins in the series so far. After holding Indiana to a then-season-low 94 points in Game 1, Milwaukee held Indiana to a season-low 92 points in Game 5 on Tuesday. Games 1 and 5 were just the second and third time this season the Pacers have not scored 100+ points, while the Bucks improve to 12-0 this season when allowing fewer than 100 points.
- Khris Middleton tallied his third consecutive game with 25+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ assists in Game 5 on Tuesday as he scored 29 points with 12 rebounds and 5 assists. Only Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (5 games in 1974) and Giannis Antetokounmpo (4 games in 2020) have had longer 25/10/5 streaks in Bucks playoff history. Middleton, who's now tallied his two highest scoring games of the season in the playoffs with 42 points in Game 3 and 29 points in Game 5, is averaging 26.8 points, 9.4 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game so far this series.
- Bobby Portis Jr. poured in a playoff-career-high 29 points in Game 5 and hauled in 10 rebounds for his first career playoff game with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds. Portis Jr. has now tallied a double-double in four of his five games this series and is averaging a double-double overall with 15.8 points and 10.6 rebounds per game. His 29 points in Game 5 were the fourth-most he's scored in a game this season and marked just the third time he's scored 20+ points in his postseason career.
- Over the last two games in the series, Malik Beasley is averaging 19.0 points per game while shooting 65.2% from the field and 61.5% from three. Starting both those games, Beasley has also knocked down 4 3s in each game, including in Game 5 on Tuesday when he went 7-for-11 from the field (4-6 3FG) and scored 18 points.

MILWAUKEE BUCKS LAST THREE GAME RECAPS

Bucks vs. Pacers – Tuesday, April 30 – Fiserv Forum – Milwaukee, WI

W, 115-92 – The Bucks forced a Game 6 in their first round series after defeating the Pacers 115-92 at Fiserv Forum in Game 5 on Tuesday. Indiana came out strong in the first quarter, making seven threes and shooting 52.4% from the field to outscore Milwaukee 23-31. Danilo Gallinari opened the scoring for the Bucks in the second quarter and tipped off a 16-2 Milwaukee run that put the Bucks on top 39-33. Pat Beverley scored 12 points in the second frame the Milwaukee's defense held Indiana to just 17 points and 35% shooting to take a 53-48 halftime lead. Milwaukee pulled ahead by double digits early in the third, but Indiana cut it to a 66-57 game with 6:46 remaining in the frame. After Brook Lopez made two free throws, Pat Connaughton forced a turnover on the Pacers' answer and Lopez made a floater that set off a 20-8 run to give the Bucks an 86-65 lead, their largest of the contest, with 1:15 left in the third. Leading 87-67 at the start of the fourth quarter, Malik Beasley scored 10 points in the frame and the Bucks shot 66.7% from the field to put an exclamation point on the win. Khris Middleton scored 29 points and hauled in a game-high 12 rebounds, while Portis Jr. finished with a playoff-career-high 29 points and 10 rebounds. Beverley also dished out a playoff-career-high 12 assists and scored 13 points. The Pacers were led by Tyrese Haliburton with 16 points.

L, 113-126 – Playing without Giannis Antetokounmpo and Damian Lillard, the Bucks fell 113-126 to the Pacers at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Game 4 on Sunday. Milwaukee and Indiana battled closely in the first quarter, with six of the game's 10 lead changes coming in the first 12 minutes, and Milwaukee's 58.3% shooting in the frame helped tie the game at 33 heading into the second quarter. The teams continued back and forth to open the second quarter, with the Bucks leading 44-43 just 3:02 into the period. The Pacers made a layup to take a 44-45 lead with 8:49 remaining in the half and the Bucks couldn't regain the lead from that point. Milwaukee shot 60.9% from the field in the second to finish the half shooting 59.6%, while Khris Middleton, Brook Lopez and Malik Beasley all reached double figures in the first half. The Bucks faltered in the third quarter while the Pacers shot 57.1% from the field to take an 85-98 lead heading into the final frame. Milwaukee struggled to overcome the deficit and Indiana, which finished with 22 total threes, took a 1-3 series lead. Lopez led the Bucks with 27 points, while Middleton (25) and Beasley (20) also reached the 20-point mark in the game. Middleton also hauled in a game-high 10 rebounds, and Andre Jackson Jr. dished out a playoff-career-high seven assists off the bench. The Pacers were led by Myles Turner with 29 points.

L, 118-121 (OT) – Khris Middleton scored a playoff-career-high 42 points, but the Bucks couldn't complete their overtime comeback, falling 118-121 to the Pacers in Game 3 at Gainbridge Fieldhouse on Friday. Indiana opened the game with a dominant first quarter and maintained a double-digit lead until Milwaukee began chipping away at the deficit at the end of the third quarter. Trailing 83-90 to open the fourth, the Bucks went on a 12-2 run to take a 95-92 lead, their first lead of the game, with 9:43 remaining in the frame. The teams exchanged lead changes and ties from that point until the Pacers took a 108-111 lead with 6.9 seconds left in regulation. Middleton made a three with 2.3 seconds remaining to tie it at 111 and force the extra period. Middleton was the Bucks' lone scorer in overtime as he battled the Pacers, and his three with 8.0 seconds left tied the game at 118. The Pacers answered with a floater with 1.6 seconds to go, and made the extra free throw to prevent the Bucks from completing the comeback. Middleton hauled in 10 rebounds in addition to his game-high 42 points, and Bobby Portis Jr. scored 17 points and hauled in a playoff-career-high 18 rebounds. Damian Lillard scored 28 points and dished out eight assists, while Brook Lopez (14) and Pat Beverley (11) also reached double figures for the Bucks. The Pacers were led by Myles Turner with 29 points.

Bucks vs. Pacers 2023-24 Game Recaps

Bucks at Pacers – Nov. 9, 2023 – Gainbridge Fieldhouse – Indianapolis, IN

L, 124-126 – Giannis Antetokounmpo scored a then-season-high 54 points as the Bucks and Pacers battled it out at Gainbridge Fieldhouse on Thursday, with the Bucks falling 124-126. Milwaukee fell behind by 18 points early in the first quarter as the Pacers opened the game shooting 50% from three. The Bucks refused to give up early and came roaring back in the second quarter, shooting 63.6% from the field and outscoring Indiana 36-28 to go into halftime with a 60-66 deficit. Antetokounmpo opened the third quarter with nine straight points that brought the Bucks within two points. Khris Middleton was fouled soon after and made both shots, tying the game at 71 points apiece with 9:32 remaining in the third. The teams fought a close quarter for the rest of the frame, with 11 lead changes and six ties that saw the Bucks come out on top with a 94-93 lead. Milwaukee kept up the momentum and opened the fourth quarter on a 19-10 run, with a Malik Beasley three giving the Bucks a 113-110 lead. The Pacers began mounting a comeback of their own and forced a tie at 119 with 2:30 left. Cameron Payne made a layup, but Indiana hit a three to take a 122-121 lead. The Bucks attempted to retake the lead but time expired before they could finish the job. Antetokounmpo also hauled in 12 rebounds to lead the Bucks while Payne dished out a team-high five assists. The Pacers were led by Tyrese Haliburton with 29 points.

Bucks vs. Pacers – In-Season Tournament Semifinals – Dec. 7, 2023 – T-Mobile Arena – Las Vegas, NV

L, 119-128 – Playing in the Semifinals of the NBA's Inaugural In-Season Tournament, the Bucks fell to the Pacers at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, 128-119. Despite a trio of Bucks scoring 20+ points, Tyrese Haliburton and Pacers were too much for the Bucks as they advanced to the Championship. Trailing 63-51 at halftime, Milwaukee came out strong in the third quarter, outscoring Indiana 43-28 in the period to take a 94-91 lead into the fourth quarter. Damian Lillard scored 16 of his 24 points in the third quarter alone, knocking down all four of his 3-point attempts in the frame. It was then a tight fourth quarter as neither team led by more than four through the first 10 minutes of action. In the final two minutes, however, the Pacers started to pull away, going up by eight at 122-114 with under a minute left to play before leading by 10 with just 27.2 seconds remaining to seal the win. Giannis Antetokounmpo led all scorers with 37 points to go along with 10 rebounds while Khris Middleton added 20 points to join Antetokounmpo and Lillard as 20-point scorers for the Bucks. Haliburton finished with 27 points and 15 assists to lead the Pacers.

W, 140-126 – Giannis Antetokounmpo scored a franchise-record 64 points as the Bucks defeated the Pacers 140-126 at Fiserv Forum on Wednesday. The top two scoring teams in the league fought a close battle, but the Bucks maintained the edge throughout much of the game. Milwaukee pulled away for the first time at the end of the third quarter, going on a 12-4 run to take a 96-80 lead. The Pacers forced it back within seven points and cut it to a 101-96 game just 41 seconds into the final frame. The Bucks opened another 12-2 run, taking a 113-98 lead, and led by double-digits from that point on. Antetokounmpo scored 26 of his 64 points in the fourth quarter and the Bucks shot 55.6% from the field to help put the Pacers away. In addition to the franchise points record, Antetokounmpo also set the franchise records for free throws (24) and free throws attempted (32). He also led the Bucks with 14 rebounds, while Khris Middleton dished out seven assists. The Pacers were led by Myles Turner and Tyrese Haliburton, who scored 22 points each.

Bucks vs. Pacers 2023-24 Game Recaps

Bucks vs. Pacers – Jan. 1, 2024 – Fiserv Forum – Milwaukee, WI

L, 113-122 – Playing in their first game at Fiserv Forum after a four-game road trip, the Bucks faltered in the fourth quarter and fell 113-122 to the Pacers on New Year's Day. Milwaukee entered the final frame with an 88-84 edge over Indiana that quickly became an 89-84 lead with an early Khris Middleton free throw. The Pacers scored six unanswered points to take an 89-90 lead, their first lead since the second quarter. Middleton put the Bucks back on top with a floating shot and a dunk from Giannis Antetokounmpo gave Milwaukee a 93-90 lead until a layup and dunk for Indiana forced another lead change. Brook Lopez sank an alley-oop dunk to tie it at 101 until Indiana pulled away, finishing with 38 fourth-quarter points. Antetokounmpo finished with a season-high 18 rebounds and had 30 points and 11 assists for his third triple-double of the season. Middleton and Lopez also each scored 21 points. Despite an evenly matched first half, the Pacers came out hot in the third quarter, opening on a 8-21 run to take a 75-87 lead over the Bucks. Indiana scored 47 third-quarter points to put Milwaukee in a 97-113 hole to start the fourth quarter. The Bucks outscored the Pacers 33-29 in the final frame as they worked to erase the deficit. Middleton made a three and Damian Lillard followed it up with a layup to cut it to a 118-128 game with 4:01 remaining. Indiana pulled ahead by 15 points again until free throws from Lillard and Antetokounmpo brought it back to 122-133 with 2:35 to go. The Bucks couldn't complete the comeback as the Pacers made back-to-back threes and both teams turned to their reserves. Antetokounmpo nearly had his second consecutive triple-double, leading the Bucks with 26 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists. Lillard finished with 23 points and Middleton made a season-high-tying four threes and scored 19 points. The Pacers were led by Tyrese Haliburton with 31 points.

A HIGH-SCORING HERD: While the Bucks improved defensively under Rivers, their offense was potent throughout the 2023-24 regular season. The Bucks averaged 119.0 points per game this season, which was the second-highest mark in franchise history and ranked 4th in the NBA. Milwaukee was able to put some up big numbers this season on its way to averaging 119.0 ppg, as it reached the 140-point mark nine times. Their nine games scoring 140+ points were the third-most in a single season in NBA history, trailing only the 10 140-point games the Nuggets had during the 1981-82 season and 11 games the Pacers tallied this season.

Antetokounmpo, in his 11th season in the NBA, averaged 30.4 points, which ranked 2nd in the NBA, and shot a career-high 61.1% from the field, which ranked 7th in the NBA. The previous high FG% in a 30 ppg season was 57.7%, which Kareem Abdul-Jabbar shot while averaging 31.1 ppg during the 1970-71 season (also with the Bucks). Prior to Antetokounmpo this season, the highest scoring average for a player who shot 60% from the field in a season was Zion Williamson who averaged 27.0 ppg on 61.1% shooting in 2020-21.

DOING IT ALL: In addition to his 30.4 points on 61.1% shooting, Antetokounmpo also ranked 6th in the NBA in rebounding (11.5 rpg) and tied for 14th in assists (career-high 6.5 apg) this season. By doing so, it marked just the ninth time in NBA history a player has averaged 30+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ assists in a season, and the second consecutive season Antetokounmpo has done it. MILWAUKEE BUCKS NEWS & NOTES

DAME TIME IN INDY: It was Dame Time in Indianapolis during NBA All-Star Weekend as Bucks guard Damian Lillard stole the show by winning the 3-point contest on Saturday before being named the MVP of the 73rd NBA All-Star Game on Sunday. In doing so, he joined Michael Jordan as the only players in NBA history to win a Saturday night event and be named MVP of the All-Star Game in the same year. Lillard won his second consecutive 3-point contest by defeating Karl-Anthony Towns and Trae Young in the final round before scoring a team-high 39 points, while knocking down a game-high 11 threes, in the All-Star Game on Sunday to win MVP.



BUCKS REPRESENT AT ALL-STAR WEEKEND: In addition to Lillard, the Bucks were well represented during NBA All-Star Weekend. Giannis Antetokounmpo, who was the league's leading vote getter and team captain for the Eastern Conference All-Stars, made his eighth consecutive All-Star Game start, while the Bucks coaching staff earned the right to coach the East All-Stars. Led by head coach Doc Rivers, it was the fourth time that Milwaukee has had its coaching staff coach the All-Star Game. Bucks guard Malik Beasley also made his NBA All-Star Weekend debut, participating in the 3-point contest alongside Lillard.

NOTEABLE GAMES & PERFORMANCES: The Bucks have had some notable team and player performances so far this season. See below for some of Milwaukee's noteworthy games from the 2023-24 season.

- Oct. 26 vs. PHI:
 - In the 2023-24 season opener, Damian Lillard scores 39 points, including 14 in the fourth quarter, to give the Bucks a season-opening 118-117 win over the 76ers. Lillard's 39 points were the most ever by a player making his Bucks debut and the fourth-most in NBA history by a player in his debut with a team.
- Nov. 3 vs. NYK:
 - In the franchise's first In-Season Tournament game, Brook Lopez blocked a career-high-tying 9 shots, helping the Bucks win their first In-Season Tournament game.
- Nov. 9 at IND:
 - Giannis Antetokounmpo scores 54 points, marking the most points scored by a Buck in a road game in franchise history.
- Nov. 24 vs. WAS:
 - Brook Lopez (39), Giannis Antetokounmpo (31) and Damian Lillard (31) each scored 30+ points, marking the first time in franchise history three players scored 30 points in the same game.
- Nov. 26 vs. POR:
 - The Bucks come back from 26 points down in the second half to defeat the Trail Blazers, 108-102. Milwaukee trailed 81-55 with 9:09 left in the third quarter before outscoring Portland 53-21 the rest of the way to pick up its largest come-from-behind win in 11 years.
- Dec. 6 vs. NYK:
 - The Bucks pour in a season-high 146 points to defeat the Knicks, 146-122, in the Quarterfinals of the In-Season Tournament at Fiserv Forum to advance to the Semifinals of the IST in Las Vegas.
- Dec. 13 vs. IND:
 - Giannis Antetokounmpo scores a franchise record and career-high 64 points, going 20-for-28 from the field (.714) and 24-for-32 from the free-throw line. By doing so, he became only the fifth player in NBA history to score 60+ points on 70% shooting.
- Jan. 14 vs. SAC:
 - Damian Lillard hits a game-winning three at the buzzer to give the Bucks a 143-142 overtime win over the Kings. With the Bucks down two, Lillard received the inbounds pass, ran the length of the court and hoisted a 32-foot jumper that was nothing but net and sent Fiserv Forum into a frenzy.
- March 10 at LAC
 - Both Giannis Antetokounmpo (34 points, 10 assists) and Damian Lillard (35 points, 11 assists) score 30+ points and dish out 10+ assists, becoming just the second pair of teammates in the NBA since 1980 to have 30+ points and 10+ assists in the same game.
- April 9 vs. BOS
 - The Bucks set an NBA record for fewest fouls committed in a game, tallying just 4 in their win over the Celtics. Boston did not attempt a free-throw in this game, becoming the first team in NBA history to not attempt a free throw.

FISERV FORUM SELLOUT STREAK: The Bucks have sold out their last 178 regular-season home games at Fiserv Forum, making Milwaukee's home court one of the toughest for opponents to play at in the NBA. Check out some notable numbers below from the Bucks' time at Fiserv Forum.

HEAD COACH DOC RIVERS



Doc Rivers, an NBA champion head coach who's won more than 1,100 games in his career, begins his first postseason at the helm of the Milwaukee Bucks. Rivers was hired as the 18th head coach in franchise history during the 2023-24 season on Jan. 26, bringing with him a championship pedigree and 24 seasons of NBA head coaching experience to Milwaukee. The 2024 postseason is his 20th playoff appearance in his 25 seasons as a head coach.

Rivers officially took over as head coach of the Bucks on Jan. 29 with 36 games remaining in the regular season and helped Milwaukee finish the 2023-24 regular season with an overall record of 49-33 and earn the three seed in the Eastern Conference playoffs. Under Rivers, the Bucks improved defensively, giving up fewer points overall while improving their defensive rating. Prior to Rivers, Milwaukee ranked 24th in the NBA, giving up 120.1 ppg, but in his 36 games to finish the season, Milwaukee ranked 13th, allowing 111.6 ppg. The Bucks also limited their opponents to fewer than 100 points nine times under Rivers after

doing so just once in their first 46 games of the season.

Rivers owns a 1,114-782 (.588) record all-time as an NBA coach and with his second victory this season, passed Larry Brown for eighth on the NBA's all-time wins list for head coaches. He is now 42 wins away from passing Phil Jackson (1,155) for seventh. The 1999-00 NBA Coach of the Year, Rivers was named one of the 15 Greatest Coaches in NBA history in 2022 by a panel of 43 current and former NBA head coaches in collaboration with the National Basketball Coaches Association.

Leading the Boston Celtics to an NBA Championship in 2008 and another NBA Finals appearance in 2010, Rivers has amassed 111 playoff wins in his career, which is good for fourth-most all-time. Of his 20 playoff appearances, 16 of them have come in the past 17 seasons going back to 2008, with the 2024 postseason being his sixth consecutive playoff trip.

Rivers began his head coaching career with the Orlando Magic from 1999-03 and has since served as head coach of the Celtics (2004-13), Los Angeles Clippers (2013-20) and Philadelphia 76ers (2020-23). With Philadelphia, Rivers led them to a 154-82 (.653) regular-season record and made the postseason all three years.


A native of Chicago and product of Proviso East High School in Maywood, Illinois, Rivers played and graduated from Marquette University, and his number 31 jersey hangs in the rafters of Fiserv Forum. After being selected in the Second Round of the 1983 NBA Draft, Rivers went on to play 13 seasons in the NBA between 1983-96 with the Hawks, Clippers, Knicks and Spurs. He appeared in 864 games in his career, including in 81 playoff games, and was an NBA All-Star in 1988.
